The Student Community Involvement Project Competition is a statewide competition that recognizes student organizations, clubs, or classes at the SC Technical College System's colleges across the state for excellence and professionalism in community service and engagement. A panel of reviewers will score entries according to the specifications below. Award winners will be notified, and representatives from the groups submitting these projects will be invited to the SCTEA annual conference on Friday, February 21st for recognition.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

- All student organizations or clubs are eligible to enter the competition. Reports from class service projects may also be entered.
- Entries must have taken place between January 1, 2024 and December 15, 2024.
- Multiple entries for the same service project will not be accepted.
- All entries must have been performed by students. Entries can be submitted by the student, instructor, advisor, or student affairs staff. Advisors, instructor, or student affairs staff may assist in drafting the report by following the criteria for submission.
- The deadline for entering the competition is December 15, 2024.
